

# Various activities carried out on 4th day of National Road Safety Week

DODA: As a part of the 31st National Road Safety Week, Motor Vehicles Department Doda conducted Crown ceremony/rose gifting to embarrass traffic rule violators, besides felicitating the commuters who follow traffic rules with medals and sensitized the general public about traffic rules near clock tower, Main Chowk Doda road and at Pul Doda road.

On the occasion, Assistant Regional Transport Officer Doda, Er Kuldeep Singh along with DSP Traffic Pankaj and other concerned officials stressed upon the necessities of the road safety especially use of helmets or seat belts, no use of mobile phone while driving or on the road.

The team conducted several roadside checks of vehicles, highlighted the dangers of poorly maintained vehicles besides imparted advice to drivers and general public to follow the traffic rules to avoid any kind of eventuality.
